How do we know?

We now know this from the work of the social sector:

- **Thousands of non-profit organizations (NPOs) have to defend human rights and judicial victims**
- **World Justice Project, published an annual report of judicial corruption in more than 100 countries**
- **International Transparency**



Official recognition

International organizations and governments have had to acknowledge the accusations of the social sector:

- **United Nations Convention against Corruption (2003)**
- **Group of States against Corruption (GRECO)**
- **European Court of Human Rights (ECHR)**



Problem

Governments do not solve

judicial corruption



Solution

**The social sector must control the judges,
because they create judicial corruption**



Why the social sector?

**Because non-profit organizations have
the commitment, knowledge and
structure needed, to control the judges**

**First in the courts and in
European laws**
